

As Against Child Abuse enters its 45th Anniversary, a series of celebration activities have been launched. Thanks to the funding from Dr. Patricia Ip Foundation Fund, the Child Protection Mobile Van had been reaching out to the districts such as Tuen Mun, Yuen Long, Tin Shui Wai, Kwai Chung and Tsuen Wan from 8 to 10 September and 13 to 15 September, having close communication with the public. Through this publicity event, we promoted our various services in prevention, education, crisis intervention, counselling and treatment, professional training, and advocacy, while conveying the

messages of positive parenting and promoting family harmony. The body of the mobile van was decorated with a cute Squly and Friends pattern design, attracting many children and parents to visit. Parents were more interested in viewing the rich exhibition contents, including our services and milestones of development, positive parenting, impact of corporal punishment, and emotional care, while the children were happy to participate in the parent-child games on the van and obtain exquisite gifts. More importantly, it was a good time for parents and children to express love to each

other through games. Thanks to the efforts of our volunteers and colleagues, nearly 1,600 families and about 4,800 people participated in this promotional event. We look forward to seeing you again in other districts in the first quarter of next year.

Against Child Abuse has been advocating for a mandatory reporting mechanism in Hong Kong to ensure early identification and intervention in serious child abuse cases. Through the concerted

efforts of the government's inter-bureau working group and stakeholders from relevant sectors, the "Mandatory Reporting of Child Abuse Ordinance" was gazetted on 19 July and will officially come into effect on 20 January 2026. This is an important milestone in protecting children. For effective implementation of the mechanism and ordinance, the priority in the 18-month transition period would be to accomplish preparation for the supporting measures, which include mandated reporter guide, regular trainings, emergency placement, manpower allocation, publicity and parental education. 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The Hong Kong Jockey Club Community Project Grant – Healthy Start Home Visiting Project

Sponsored by the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust

The Healthy Start Home Visiting Project is initiated by the Against Child Abuse in 1997. This project aims at facilitating parents-to-be who live in Tuen Mun, Yuen Long and Tin Shui Wai to develop a set of skills and concepts in order to nurture their newborn babies in a healthy and safe manner, and learn breastfeeding skills by means of home visitations, trained volunteers' support and parents activities. These help minimize anxiety and stresses in the pre- and post-natal stages and in child care, facilitating families to appreciate the true "joy of life".

To Compose with Child, to Grow with Child Parent Education Talk and Baby Birthday Party

To share the joy of life, we hold birthday parties to celebrate every year. This year, on 20 July, we organised the To Compose with Child, to Grow with Child Parent Education Talk and Baby Birthday Party at Ho Ngai College (Sponsored by Sik Sik Yuen). Approximately 30 families participated, marking the first large-scale birthday celebration since the pandemic. It was a special opportunity for families to reunite and share the joyful learning moments together.

Music for Children

We invited Ms. Chan Ka Hei, a registered music therapist from Australia, to lead a talk for parents on Using Music to Support Children's Language Development. She shared insights on how music connects with language development, explaining that the sense of rhythm can help children better grasp the rhythm and intonation of language through singing and prosody. Ms. Chan also demonstrated how to use songs about fruits and pictures to engage children in focused learning, helping them memorize different fruits, recognize colors, and interact with one another. The participating parents were highly engaged, and the speaker further expanded with live music interactions with the audience.

Birthday Celebration and Interactive Games

After the seminar, we gathered in the activity room for parent-child games, including a scavenger hunt and music interactive games. Everyone joined in singing the birthday song, showering the birthday child with warm wishes.

In addition to the volunteers who assisted with childcare during the event, some volunteers also took on the roles of emcee and gift ambassadors. Also some volunteers prepared a variety of delicious, age-appropriate foods for a delightful feast. The atmosphere was filled with joy, and everyone enjoyed a delightful morning. We sincerely thank every volunteer who had dedicated their time to support the baby birthday party, making this event a success!

The Good Parents' Networking Project provides parenting education activities for families in the Kwai Tsing District. Through the efforts of positive parenting training courses and parent-child activities, the project aspires to strengthen parent-child communication, foster family harmony, and create a spirit of mutual aid in the community.

To celebrate the summer vacation with children, we organised a series of enriching and exciting parent-child activities from July to August. The activities covered a variety of themes, such as arts and crafts, science experiments, and baking, including Making of Handcraft Clay Photo Frame on 25 July, Sand Drawing on 31 July, Balloon Twisting Workshop on 17, 19 and 26 August, Explosive Volcano DIY on 2 August and Bread Pudding Making Day on 21, 26 and 31 August. During the process, parents and children shared ideas and creativity, enhancing their interaction and communication. At the same time, craft-making can stimulate children's imagination, develop their hand-eye coordination and fine motor skills, and boost their sense of accomplishment.

We also held Summer Parent-child Activity Movie Watching on 15 July, Summer Vibe Party on 11 August and Parent-child Bread-making Workshop on 30 August. Parents and children not only created lasting, delightful memories, but also enjoyed closer relationships and developed stronger family cohesion.

In addition to parent-child activities, Summer Magicians was organised on 15 August. Instructors taught children how to perform magic tricks by using simple props. This helped cultivate the children's focus and enhance their self-image.

In terms of public education, we held exhibition booths in Shek Lei on 24 July in order to get in touch with more parents in the community. Through service outreach, child protection messages and positive parenting skills are promoted.

Play Connect Happy Growth Positive Parenting Project Sponsored by Save the Children Hong Kong

A 2-year project "Play Connect Happy Growth" Positive Parenting Project was commenced on 1 July 2024. This project, for families with toddlers aged 12 to 30 months, aims to foster parent-child relationship and strengthen positive parenting through parent-child playgroups and parent education.

This project is divided into three parts, including Sensory Play Groups, Positive Parenting Programs and Community Education Programs. Sensory Play Groups provides a platform for parents and toddlers to enrich their bonding through games. Meanwhile, children's cognitive development and emotional expression can be enhanced through sensory activities. Also, this group-based approach allows parents to share experiences and information about community, helping to form a supportive network.

In Positive Parenting Programs and Community Education Programs, the project creates it impacts on positive parenting through educational talks, parenting training workshops and parent-child mass programs at our centre. Besides, we will work with kindergartens and primary schools to promote interactive play and positive parenting techniques. Last but not least, we will conduct street booths to promote child protection and positive parenting. The project aims to provide resources for parents to seek guidance on effective parenting strategies building up a positive nurturing environment for children to grow and develop.

Bless My Home Forever Volunteer Home Visitation Project Sponsored by the Community Chest of Hong Kong



The Bless My Home Forever Project aims to support families living in the Sham Shui Po District. Through regular volunteer home visitations, sharing sessions, community education and parent-child outings, the project helps participating families foster a desirable environment in which children can grow up in. They learn knowledge and skills in strengthening positive parenting, children's safety, community resources and ways to enhance parent-child relationships.

The Project invited social worker, Ms Wong Lee Ki, from the Sham Shui Po District Health Centre to share health information with the project families on 22 August 2024. The families not only learnt about the relationship between health and emotions but also understood how to manage their children's health. Besides, the social worker introduced the facilities and services of the District Health Centre. The project families could learn more about the community resources and sign up for the Centre's activities in the future. On the same day, another social worker from the District's Health Centre was also invited to prepare nutritious snacks for the families and promote a healthy diet. The parents and children expressed that the snacks were delicious and planned to make them again at home.

Daylily Project for Young/Single Mothers Sponsored by the Community Chest of Hong Kong



The Daylily Project aims to support young or single mothers in their self-development, emotional needs, childcare practices, and in building up a rich social network.

This summer, we encouraged parents to attend a sharing forum on relaxation and positive parenting. Additionally, we were pleased to work with our project volunteers, volunteers from Hong Kong Red Cross plans, Midland Realty and Emperor Group to organise various activities for our target families in the summer holidays, such as a Day Tour to Ocean Park, Sunday Boardgame Fun, Visit to Tai Kwun, Happy Drawings, Mandala Painting Experience Day and Enjoy Movie Time. Besides, we organised volunteer gatherings and volunteer advanced trainings with the themes of Mental Health, Home Visitation Skills and Crisis Management and SEN Children: Needs & Support regularly. We aim to equip our volunteers with home visitation skills and strengthen their cohesion, giving better support to the target families.

Joyful Kids Group -Child Development Group



Joyful Kids is a group formed by children aged 7 to 17 and some young volunteers, aiming to facilitate personal growth and the all-round development of children and youth, the Group provides training and voluntary services to help members unleash their full potential.

During the summer vacation, we organised a series of activities, including six sessions of Fun Board Game Group, six sessions of Creative Craft Class, five sessions of Leaders Training, and Joyful Kids Day Camp, aimed at enhancing the skills of our members and promoting their social, emotional, and cognitive development, as well as fostering their sense of belonging. Members built friendships during the activities and learned to interact with groupmates of different ages. In particular, in the Board Game Group, members had to consider the needs of younger participants and respect each other's preferences, accommodating one another. After six sessions, members showed significant improvement in logical thinking, patience, and tolerance, and they were able to negotiate independently, enjoying many joyful moments together.

Another important goal of this year's summer activities was to strengthen members' self-awareness and collaboration skills. The design of activities in the leadership training and day camp included many self-exploration tasks, such as rock climbing and individual problem-solving challenges, allowing members to understand their strengths and weaknesses and promote personal growth. Members also learned how to resolve conflicts through group activities, thus enhancing their ability to cooperate and communicate with others.

Additionally, in the Creative Craft Class, members learned various creative mediums and methods, such as Zentangle and Decoupage. The sense of achievement after completing their projects further boosted their confidence.

Chuk Yuen Centre Family Corner



Chuk Yuen Family Corner continued to bring a variety of activities to Wong Tai Sin residents, hoping to promote parent-child relationships and strengthen the community through diverse events.

In January, we held the Writing Workshop for Parents which some participants expressed a desire for the workshop to be conducted in a parent-child format, allowing both parents and children to learn penmanship and writing skills together. In response, the Family Corner took advantage of the summer break and organised 4 sessions of Parent-child Writing Workshop from July to August, enabling parents and children to participate together. Seven pairs of parent-child participated. During the program, we observed that the parents' positive learning attitude served as a role model for their children, and we encouraged parents to incorporate this role modeling into their daily lives, starting a good learning attitude and be their children's role models.

On 17 August, with the sponsorship of Asian Alliance (HK) CPA Limited, the Family Corner hosted a Natural Indigo Dyeing Parent-Child Workshop. Nine pairs of families participated in the program. We invited parents and children to learn about the role of natural dyes in protecting the environment and to experience the fun of tie-dyeing. Although it was their first time tie-dyeing, participants quickly grasped the basic techniques under the guidance of the instructor. During the hands-on session, parents and children needed to help each other, share their ideas, and collaboratively create a unique piece that belonged to them. It is truly a good experience!

In the evening of 13 September, the Family Corner held the CYFC Mid-Autumn Festival at Chuk Yuen North Estate. The event applied for funding through the Community Involvement Program in Wong Tai Sin District, supported by the Home Affairs Department. The program included Solving Riddles, Booth Game, and Starry Sky Lamp Workshop. At 4pm on the day of the event, volunteers and staff began hanging lanterns and string lights for decoration, instantly filling the venue with a festive atmosphere. By 6pm, the Mid-Autumn Festival celebration officially began, and residents, both adults and children, came to join the festivities. They actively participated in the riddle guessing and booth activities, creating a lively atmosphere. Meanwhile, the Starry Sky Lamp Workshop gradually illuminated various colorful starry balls, becoming one of the highlights of the event, with many locals praising their beauty! During the middle of the event, it began to rain. With the assistance of volunteers, we moved the event to the center's conference room and the area under the awning. Although it drizzled throughout, this did not deter the community's participation, as the flow of people continued until the event ended at 9pm. The Mid-Autumn Festival celebration attracted over 900 participants, successfully creating a joyful festive atmosphere in the community, promoting interaction among family members, and fostering community cohesion. Both volunteers and staff felt happy and fulfilled!

Joyful Block Play Parent-child Workshop

On 12 and 19 August, Joyful Block Play Parent-child Workshop was held at Kwai Chung Center. During the event, participants engaged in simple cooperative games using six-colored building blocks, adding an element of fun to the activity. Children not only enjoyed the workshop, but also learned about four basic emotions — joy, anger, sorrow, and happiness through the use of the six-colored building blocks. They also explored methods and techniques for positive emotional expression. Additionally, with the assistance of building blocks, children were able to express their emotions more concretely.

Parent-child Pizza Making

The plan supported families in participating in a parent-child pizza-making activity. Participants had the opportunity to visit a pizza factory together on 17 August and make their own pizzas. Families experienced the process of pizza-making, selected ingredients and baked the pizza with the chef's guidance. Child Protection Institute

We put much effort into prevention, advocacy and education to enhance public awareness of Child Protection and promote the Child Protection Policy (CPP) to safeguard children's rights in our society. The Mandatory Reporting of Child Abuse Bill was gazetted on 19 July 2024. Frontline workers from the social welfare, health and education sectors are required to report suspected child abuse cases. Professionals are concerned about its implementation and the awareness in child protection. Recently, there are many enquires and applications from schools and organisations for the Child Protection Institute's trainings



workshop on the Identification and Handling of Suspected Child Abuse Cases and certificate courses on Identification, Assessment and Intervention of Suspected Child Abuse Case. We hope to facilitate the multi-disciplinary professional collaboration, to promote advocacy on Child Protection Policy and the practice of children's rights in Hong Kong for children's well-being.

Summer Activities

Tuen Mun Centre organised a series of summer activities from July to August to help children develop self-care abilities and build self-confidence through workshops and activities. Honey Family Parent-child Dessert Group made different types of desserts, such as cranberry cookies and taro balls, allowing children and parents to share their effort with each other. The Little Chef Training Class -Children's Self-care Group taught children basic cooking skills and cultivated children's self-care ability through purchasing ingredients, preparing materials and cooking techniques. The first three lessons taught children how to cook cuisines from different countries and regions, such as Japanese, Korean, Western, and Southeast Asian. In the last lesson, the children decided on their recipes and worked together to complete different dishes.

ACA Tuen Mun Go Out! was held near our



centre and the parks in Tuen Mun, Tin Shui Wai and Yuen Long District. The activities allowed children to understand the importance of teamwork and develop their interest in orienteering, map reading skills and orienteering strategy abilities, thereby building self-confidence. Messy Play – a multi-sensory playground for children utilises multi-sensory games in different scenarios to increase sensory stimulation and skills in getting along with others, making parents and children happy.

Project Illuminating Sponsored by Dr Patricia Ip Foundation Fund



In recent years, the mental health of children and their caregivers has always been a concerning issue in the community. Against Child Abuse has released a 2-year project, Project Illuminating (PI Project), which aims at showing concern for the mental health of caregivers and children. The programmes include family interviews, mental health promotion workshops, caregiver groups, parent-child activities, mental health-related activities for children and adolescents, drama therapy and creative arts therapy. The Caregivers' Life Exhibition will be conducted recapping the whole project. Moreover, the project provides knowledge and trainings about mental health and positive parenting skills, which enhances parent-child relationships and promotes the public awareness and understanding towards mental health.

The PI Project has launched promotional activities since August 2024. Upcoming activities from October to December will include: 1) The ACA Illuminating Caregivers Workshop Roadshow - Talk on Chinese Medicine Dietary Therapy. A Hong Kong registered Chinese Medicine Practitioner will be invited to deliver a live demonstration on Chinese soup-making, as well as sharing the techniques of improving the mental health of caregivers with the use of acupoint massage and Chinese Medicine Dietary Therapy; 2) The Caregivers Mutual Help Groups with the theme of Living Arts and The 5 Love Languages will be conducted. These groups aim at facilitating parent-child relationships and strengthening their positive parenting and communication capabilities; 3) The Illuminating Academy -Floriculture course will be organised. The course, led by a certified Florist, will touch on technique of flower care, flower arrangement, bouquet-production and basic floral design.; 4) The Mental Health-related Activity for Children and Adolescents – Escape Room Activity, which enables children and adolescents to resolve problems and riddles in a

teamwork settings, will be conducted. This helps develop and train participants' collaboration, communication, problem-solving, logical-thinking, observation and reasoning skills; 5) The Shine on You Parent-child Activity – Outdoor BBQ and Fun Day will be conducted in mid-December. Parents and their children will enjoy their Quality Time together throughout the activity. A Registered Social Worker will lead parent-child fun games and assign designated challenges. The activities aim to facilitate the positive communication skills among parents and children, as well as to equip parents with positive parenting techniques.

The PI Project will distribute promotion leaflets to local community organisations and schools quarterly, with the details of activity enrollment methods. Activity details will also be posted in ACA Facebook page. For inquiry, please contact Ms Lam at Tuen Mun Centre at 2450 2244.
